** The Sunken Cathedral - program notes

The tenth prelude of Book I, *La cathédrale engloutie* ("The Sunken Cathedral") is based on the ancient Breton legend of the Cathedral of Ys. A mythical city built off the coast of Brittany, Ys was the most beautiful city in Europe, but was submerged into the ocean as judgment for the sins of the king's daughter. According to the legend, the city's cathedral rises up from the ocean depths on clear mornings and the sounds of priests and bells can be heard. Debussy ingeniously creates the sonorous and magical landscape of the legend throughout the prelude in his use of anachronistic techniques, such as the open fifths of the opening, suggesting simultaneously the archaic *organum* techniques of music in the Middle Ages, the clear ring of church bells, and the vast expanse of the ocean depths. Furthermore, the chant-like melody that appears throughout the prelude is perhaps meant to be the song of the cathedral's priests.

Exodus 15 NRSV

- <u>1</u>Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord: "I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea.
- 2 The Lord is my strength and my might, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him.
- 3 The Lord is a warrior; the Lord is his name.
- <u>4</u> "Pharaoh's chariots and his army he cast into the sea; his picked officers were sunk in the Red Sea.
- 5 The floods covered them; they went down into the depths like a stone.
